



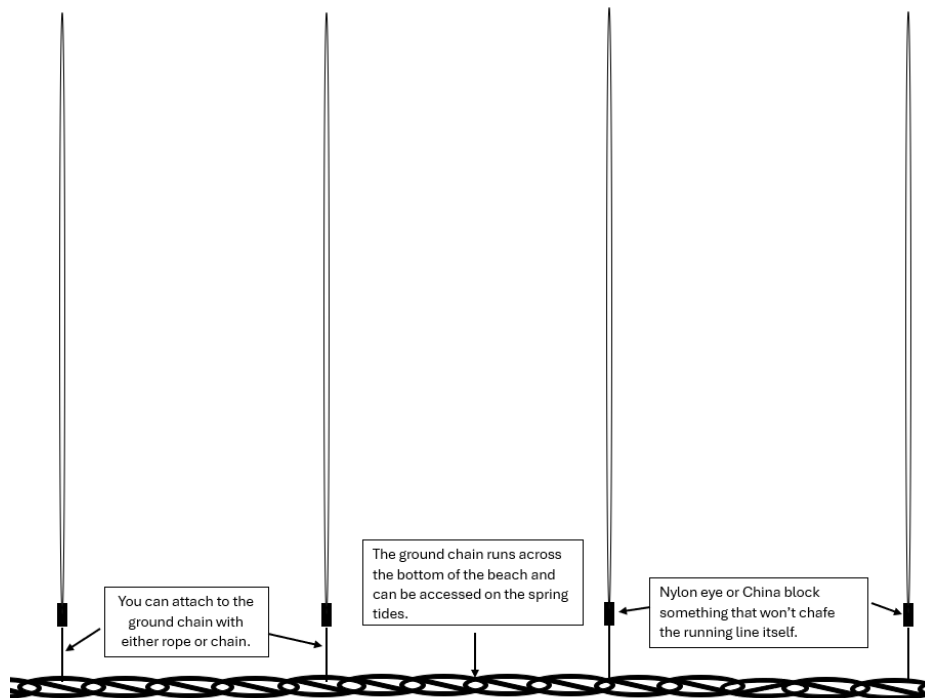

Running Line Guide

Following on from a recent inspection of the running lines on Town beach we just want to make sure everyone understands what we expect of our customers. Running lines should be kept clean and tight not drifting across other lines making others unusable.

Below is a diagram of how the running lines look on the lowest tide. Running the length of the beach across the bottom is a large stud link chain. You attach to this with 1 or 2 meters of chain or rope, before your pot spinner or block. See images below.



Once you have got the chain and pulling block secure to the ground chain you can run your 3-strand rope through the block up round your numbered post/ring and back down to meet the other end leaving sufficient line for the splice and to secure your line either to your ring or post. It is up to you whether you put the rope



through the ring before splicing or leave it separate. Here is an example of the splice you will need to do to allow the rope to run freely and not get caught up.
