

Swinging Mooring Guide

Within the harbour we have various sized moorings. Closest to town beach, there are 2 rows, (A, B) for vessels up to 16ft 4.8m. The (C) Row is for up to 18ft 5.5m. The (D) Row is for up to 20ft 6.1m. Then multiple rows for up to 30ft 9m. (E,H,I,J,K,L,M,N,O,P,Q,R,T,U,V).



Hopefully this diagram will give you a rough understanding of the rows.

The ones running parallel to the beach are curved slightly to the shape of the beach. Mooring A1 is closest to the beach at the lifeboat slip end. And the rows running away from the beach (H to V) start with 1 closest to the E row.

When tying up to the buoy we advise having 2 strops. The main strop going to the strongest part of the boat. Either the D ring or the cleat/post. The secondary line is set a couple of feet longer and is only there in case the main strop parts. When securing the shackle, we would discourage people using cable ties and opt to use metal mousing wire instead.



If needed, we can make up strops at the harbour. Just pop into the office to enquire. We have 2 different sizes of nylon rope. 24mm in white, And 14mm in black.
